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The Good, The Bad and the Ugly – Dealing With Service Issues

A survey conducted recently shed a little light on both good and not-so good experiences with services provided under ACES contract. We would like to remind everyone that ACES highly values communication and is here to help both Participating Agencies and Contractors achieve mutual satisfaction to the extent possible under any of our contracts. If you are experiencing any problems under an ACES contract, either as a participating agency or contractor, we encourage you to reach out to either Christy Takacs or Tammy West and let us help mediate the situation. Our contracts contain minimum and/or mandatory service requirements and often detail the responsibilities of both the participating agency and the vendor when utilizing and performing services. When trouble arises, please consider involving ACES early in the process and let us attempt to work on your behalf to clarify, mediate, or remedy the situation. Sometimes, company and agency representative(s) working with each other on a regular basis may not be passing necessary information up the chain to managers or administrators who have the authority to influence change. It is also important that ACES be aware of any problems under our contracts so we can document issues and utilize that documentation when vetting vendors for future contracts. We encourage you to help us be proactive in dealing with any uncomfortable or downright bad situations by calling or reaching out via email to share your experience and let us see if we can assist and achieve resolution sooner rather than later. Also, if you are experiencing a really good relationship with a contractor, we would **LOVE** to hear about that as well!

ACES Food Service Contracts

I would like to take a step back to a few solicitations we did when I first started working with ACES in 2022, for Food Services and Cafeteria Food and Supplies and would like to highlight the following in regard to those contracts:

- · Any ACES Participating Agency can utilize an ACES contract for food services if available doing so *negates* the requirement for the school to conduct their own RFP.
- · We work closely with the NM PED's Student Success and Wellness Bureau on developing specifications and when contracting.
- · ACES has multiple contractors to choose from who offer both Cost Reimbursement and Fixed Cost food services, as well as a contract that offers cafeteria food and supplies; Note that food service contractors cannot provide services to all schools in all locations. We are hoping to

encourage more vendor participation and secure additional vendors the next time the contract is solicited.

- · We understand these contracts are complex and can be confusing. We continue to learn more about the contracts and requirements and often make notes regarding changes we plan to incorporate into the next RFP and contracts in an attempt to make the documents (including the SFA Questionnaire) easier to understand and use, while also maintaining compliance with USDA and PED. Any input you may have in this regard is welcome.
- · If ACES does not have the ability to provide a contractor for your school due to unique circumstances or inability to provide services in your area, we might be able to assist you in conducting an RFP for food services specific to your school.
- · If your school food budget is strained due to high charges for food services or you feel you cannot afford food service management, please allow us the opportunity to investigate how we and our Contractors may be able work to provide food services within your budget.
